Edward Gledhill born 31st July, 1811

In Compton, Yorkshire, England.

Betty Hague Gledhill born 8th July, 1814

In Shaw, Lancashire England near Compton.

Edward Gledhill was a member of the Methodist Church. His wife leaned to the Prespiterian church. They were geting on cery congenially till the early part of the year 1849, when his wife had a dream, or vision, of two mwn coming to their home who claimed to have the true gospel and warning her her to give heed to what they had to say to her. Some time in June two men called at their door when she was alone. She recogniz-ed them as the two men she saw in her dream. They were made welcome and they made regu-lar visits at the Gledhill home. She became converted to the principles of the gospel as taught by them and was baptized on the

3rd of September, 1849 by William Scofield and confirmed a member of the church by Daniel Hall.

Edward Gledhill was baptized September 3rd 1850 by William Scofield and confirmed the same day by Luke Nield. They were very energetic in their labors in the the church work in England and always had an open house for the Elders and Missionaries. They died in full fellowship in the church in 1888 and after their death were endowed in the Manti Temple and were sealed together and had all their children sealed to them May 28th 1889.

Edward and Betty Hague Gledhill and the younger part of the family emigrated from Oldham, Lancashire England in 1868 and came to Salt Lake City the same fall. The four older children had emigrated in 1862 and got Salt Lake City that fall, except Sophia who died at Florence, Nebraska on the way to Utah.

Two of their older children lived in Mount

Pleasant. John Edward, their oldest son and Mary Gledhill Barton.

The family came on to Mount Pleasant, except Violet, who stayed at the mouth of Weber Canyon, where Bernard Snow, husband of her oldest sister. Sarah Gledhill Snow had a contract building grade on the Union Pacific railroad which was being built at that time.

The family made their home in Mount Pleasant till 1876 when they came to Vermillion in Sevier County where I and my wife Amelia, their youngest daughter lived. The two younger boys, Joseph and Thomas were also there and their oldest son John E. Gledhill and family and their two son-in-laws, John Thalman and Aaron Bulkley and their families. and they all built up homes in Vermillion.

My brother Hans and I had bought out a quitclaim to 160 acres of land of Elisha B. Keyes with a house on. We let father Gledhill and wife move into the house and an agreement entered into to the effect that

they should have five acres of land with the house on and they were to file a homestead claim on the land and after proving up, We, my brother and I were to have the land except the five acres and house, and we were to pay all expences of improvement and cost to Government. The old people made it their home till they died, both in the year 1898. After the death of the old people the land was probated and decreed to the heirs. This was brought about by the maneuvering of John Gledhill and Hans and I got but very little out of the two hundred dollars that we paid to Elisha Keyes for his right to the land and quitclaim.
